

Luigi Alici (Grottazzolina, 1950) graduated from Classics High School Diploma (Liceo Ginnasio "A. Caro", Fermo) and earned a degree in Philosophy in 1973 (University of Perugia).

He served as Research Fellow (1973-1980), Permanent Researcher (1980-1988), and Associate Professor of Moral Philosophy (1988-1995) at the University of Perugia, Faculty of Philosophy and Human Sciences.

Since 1995 he has worked as Full Professor of Moral Philosophy at the University of Macerata, Department of Philosophy and Human Sciences. He also gives lectures in Philosophy of History, Ethics and Anthropology, Bioethics.

Teaching "Care Ethics" (Master "Narrative Medicine, Communication and Care Ethics", Department of Humanities, University of Macerata / School of Medicine and Surgery, Marche Polytechnic University).

His research activity arises from a re-reading of St. Augustine's thought, carried out on the basis of some contemporary philosophical issues. In particular, his interests focus on the relationship between interiority and intentionality, communication and action, with increasing attention to some topics such as the connection between personal identity, relationality, reciprocity and affective bonds, examined from a moral viewpoint. The recent research is devoted to the themes of fragility, care ethics, and relationship between nature and freedom.

Luigi Alici is responsible for some projects funded by the University of Macerata; he participates in many Prin research projects within the same university (1997, 1998, 2001, 2004, 2007), in the local unity coordinated by Professor Francesco Totaro.

He participates in the "Project on the History of Care", chaired by Professor T. Reich Warren (Georgetown University, Washington); within this project he is the author of a "Research Report" on the topic "Care for the enemy, between love and justice" (2002).

He is the coordinator of two research projects which have been funded by the "Veritatis Splendor" Institute of Bologna, ("Comunità, ethos, istituzioni: le forme della mediazione intersoggettiva", 2002-2003; "Forme storiche del bene condiviso: virtù, pratiche di vita, istituzioni", 2005-2006), and he is the editor of the published proceedings.

Together with Professor Antonio Pieretti (University of Perugia) and Remo Piccolomini (Director of "Nuova Biblioteca Agostiniana"), he contributed to establish and to chair the "Centro di Studi Agostiniani" (1988), also by promoting a series of specialized seminars and by being the editor of the published proceedings.
