

# **Curriculum vitae**

## **Guido Giglioni**

I am Associate Professor of History of Philosophy (Professore di ruolo – II fascia / Storia della filosofia, M-FIL/06) at the University of Macerata. From 2004 to August 2017, I worked as the Cassamarca Senior Lecturer in Neo-Latin Cultural and Intellectual History at the Warburg Institute, School of Advanced Study, University of London. I studied philosophy at the University of Macerata, Italy, where I earned my Laurea in November 1987. In 2002 I obtained my PhD in History of Science and Medicine at the Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore. I then received a post-doctoral Research Fellowship at the Dibner Institute, MIT, Boston. Before moving to the US, I worked for nine years (from 1989 to 1998) as a Tecnico Laureato and then Researcher in theoretical philosophy and history of philosophy, at the University of Macerata. From 2009 to 2014 I was the recipient and Principal Investigator of a European ERC grant on a project dealing with Francis Bacon and a new way of considering his place in the history of early modern philosophy.

## **Funding**

I was the Principal Investigator in a European Research Council Starting Grant under the European Community's 7<sup>th</sup> Framework Programme. The title of the project was 'The Medicine of the Mind and Natural Philosophy in Early Modern England: A New Way of Interpreting Francis Bacon'. This five-year research project (start date: 2009-12-01; end date: 2014-11-30) was carried out in conjunction with the New Europe College (Colegiul Nouă Europă) in Bucharest. Two colloquia at the Warburg Institute and three workshops in Bucharest have been organized as part of the project. The ERC project (899,886 €) paid for part of my salary and covered a fully-funded PhD studentship.

I also got funding from the British Academy (Workshop on the interplay of faith and reason at the German Historical Institute in London, in September 2014) and the Fondazione Cassamarca, Treviso (Conference on early modern Averroism at the Warburg Institute in June 2008).

## **Teaching**

As Associate Professor of History of Philosophy at the University of Macerata, I have been teaching courses on history of philosophy in the past five years (see my page <http://docenti.unimc.it/guidomaria.giglioni#content=teaching>).

So far, I have supervised 11 PhD students. They came from a variety of scholarly traditions and they worked on diverse topics, linguistic sources and methodologies. Currently I am supervising 5 PhD students. As External Examiner, I have examined 12 PhD students.

## Collaborations

I have collaborated with Marie-Dominique Couzinet (Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne) to the project “Nouveaux Organons: Ramus, Bacon, Descartes et la fabrique de nouveaux outils de pensée à l'aube de la modernité” (2019-2020).
