Lesson 3: Paraphrase by Changing Nouns to Verbs

You have to decide by tomorrow.

Purpose: Some sentences use a noun that is a verb. Some people write like this because they want to make long sentences. Sometimes this is a good style, especially for university essays.

To paraphrase well, it is a good idea to know how to change these sentences. This will help you write clear sentences with fewer words.

What to do: Rewrite these sentences. Change the noun into a verb. Here are two examples.

You have to give us your decision by tomorrow.
