

## **GUIDELINES FOR THE FINAL EXAM**

The final exam is made up of two parts, **a written and an oral one**. (English level B2+)

**Students are required to pass (18+) the written part to be admitted to the oral discussion.**

In case of an insufficient grade, the profile must be resubmitted at least 15 days before the oral exam you intend to take.

Each group of students (approx. 2-4 members) will draw up an original **1000-word** project. **LM62** will prepare a **DEVELOPMENT AID** project.

You can send it via Teams, wetransfer.com or another free file share if the file is more than 2mb. It should be sent to both me and Prof.ssa Vitali

Type: PowerPoint or something similar

**DEADLINE for ALL (both attending and non-attending students):**

**Friday April 28, 2023**

For late papers, in this case, the maximum achievable mark will be 25 out of 30.

In the case of a late paper, it must be handed in at least 15 days before the oral exam you intend to take.

- 0 points: 18-22 (grade D)
- 1 point: 23-25 (grade C)
- 2 points: 26-28 (grade B)
- 3 points: 29-30 (grade A)

### **PROGRAM FOR NON-ATTENDING STUDENTS**

The only difference of the program for non-attending students is the possibility of drawing up the project individually, rather than in a group. There is no other difference. This option is not available for attending students.

**LM62 – DEVELOPMENT AID project stating (ca. 1000 words):**

- the objective (building a school, setting up a training programme, improving women's conditions through selected activities, etc.)
- the geographical place and the local beneficiary community
- the promotional and practical activities that are envisaged
- the implementation schedule
- how funds will be raised
- the expected benefits

The project is designed to attract a potential sponsor; it should therefore be realistic, achievable and convincing.
